Class 1A – 08:30 – Murray Arena – Netherton Equestrian BHS Scotland Riding Club Style Jumping Championship Final

BHS Scotland Riding Club Style Jumping Championship Final. For British Riding Club Members. All entrants must have qualified at one of the preliminary rounds held throughout Scotland. To be run under the rules of British Riding Clubs. The Winner will be presented with the BHS Scotland Training Committee Equitation Jumping Perpetual Quaich. The course will have 8 to 12 obstacles, maximum 85cm in height with a maximum spread of 90cm one of which should be a double. All aspects of the course should comply with BS standards. The optimum speed for this competition is set at 325mpm. One penalty point will be deducted for every second over the optimum time.

For registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members. Club Members are NOT eligible. Qualifies for: National 1.40m Championship at the British Showjumping National Championships. Qualifying period: 1st July - 30th June Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify to the final. Also any two double clears from any International Trial or Area Trial or classes 1.40m or above in the qualifying period will qualify for the Final. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round)) FEI tack rules apply with exception of Padded batons and Spurs which must comply with National rules 101.9 & 102.9. Standing martingales are permitted in line with rule 102.3.

## Class 5a - 09:00 - Murray Arena - Senior Newcomers Championship - First Round

Rule 312. Single Phase. Speed 325mpm. Start Height 1.10m.

In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split and two sets of prize money awarded. Horses (or ponies in pony competitions) may compete in one section only.

Entry qualifications: to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members. Club Members are NOT eligible.(a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 375 points. Four double clears will qualify - in accordance with rule 312.6(b) For all horses born on or after 1st January 2019, irrespective of Points. Horses will only be eligible for double clear qualification to Second Rounds if they reach the age of six years or under in the same calendar year as the Senior Newcomers Final - in accordance with Rule 312.6. Rule 102.16, British Showjumping Hind Boot rule for Boots / Leg Protection applies to this class. Qualifies for: Senior Newcomers Championship - Second Round.Qualifying period:1st May to 30th April(subject to revision). Numbers to qualify: Those horses which jump a clear round in the First Round, followed by a clear round in the jump-off, in at least four Senior Newcomers First Round competitions in the qualifying period, will qualify to compete in a Senior Newcomers Second Round, irrespective of their placings for prize money in those competitions, which will be determined by the normal Table A Rules (Rule 191). To obtain a double clear qualification, even if the horse is the only clear round, it must jump a jump-off round and jump clear to gain a double clear round. If combined with an open: In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split with two sets of prize money.

Those riders not listed on the British Showjumping Gold League as of 31st March 2025 will be eligible to qualify for the National 1.15m Members Cup Final. Qualifies for: British Showjumping National Championships. Qualification period: 1st June-31st May. Numbers to qualify: Two double clears (subject to revision). Qualification is horse/rider combination. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round)).

Rule 310. Single Phase. Speed 350mpm. Start Height 1.20m.

Kindly sponsored by Redpost Equestrian Ltd In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split and two sets of prize money awarded. Horses (or ponies in pony competitions) may compete in one section only.

Entry qualifications: to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members. Club Members are NOT eligible.(a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 700 points. Four double clears will qualify - in accordance with rule 310.6(b) For all registered horses born on or after 1 January 2018, irrespective of points. Horses will be eligible for double clear qualification to attend second rounds providing they reach the age of seven years or under in the same calendar year as the Senior Foxhunter Final - in accordance with rule 310.6 Four double clears will qualify. Rule 102.16 British Showjumping hind boot rule for boots/leg protection applies in this class. Qualifies for: The Senior Foxhunter Championship - Second Round. Qualifying period: 1st May to 30th April(subject to revision). Numbers to qualify: Those horses that jump a clear round in the First Round, followed by a clear round in the jump-off, in at least four Senior Foxhunter First Round competitions in the qualifying period will qualify to compete in the Second Rounds, irrespective of their placings for prize money. Horses in the class must go into the jump off and go clear to gain its double clear round qualification. Those horses that have competed in the Senior Foxhunter Championship in 2024 are not eligible for qualification to the 2025 Championship. If combined with an open: In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split with two sets of prize money.

The Scottish Branch North West Championship Trophy will be presented to the highest placed Scottish rider registered & residing in Scotland at the Awards Ball in 2025. Qualifies for: The British Showjumping National Championships. Qualifying period: 1st July-30th June. Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (Table A4 or Table A (1 Round))

#### NOTES FOR COMPETITORS FROM SCONE PALACE INTERNATIONAL HORSE TRIALS

All competitors are assumed to have read these notes. Any questions arising out of the Show will be determined by reference to these notes.

#### **EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS**

All horses and ponies entering the venue must be vaccinated against equine influenza according to standard British Horseracing Authority guidelines, with the last vaccination having been administered no more than 365 days prior to entry to the venue. All animals must have completed the primary course of two vaccinations. The last vaccination must have been administered at least 7 days before entering the venue.

Random passport checks will be implemented to verify vaccination status. Any animal identified without a valid vaccination protocol or if the owner/rider is unable to produce a valid passport will result in immediate ejection of that animal from the venue. No refunds will be issued in respect of entries or stabling.

#### ENTRIES/REFUNDS

Entries close on Mon 4 August – no late entries will be accepted. Entry fees cannot be refunded under any circumstances after closing date.

ENTRIES MAY BE LIMITED IN SOME CLASSES AT THE ORGANISERS DISCRETION

**SUBSTITUTIONS**: as per BS rules.

#### PRIZE MONEY

In the event of insufficient starters, lower prize money will be withheld in accordance with Rule 76.6

#### COLLECTING RING/WARM UP ARENA

Ponies must remain in the collecting ring/warm up arena until called forward. Any areas between the arenas are to be always kept clear. This includes pedestrians, whether they be competitors or general public. No dogs or pushchairs to be allowed into this area. Please note that there is a good 5-10 min walk to the collecting ring/warm up arena.

**PROTECTIVE HEADWEAR** of the appropriate standard must be worn by everyone, whether or not a competitor, whenever mounted anywhere at this event. Harnesses must always be correctly adjusted and fastened.

**CONTROL OF ANIMALS**: Any competitor/owner who cannot adequately control their animal may be required to immediately leave the parkland, on the direction of an Official. No refunds will be issued in respect of entries or stabling.

**DOGS:** Dogs must always be on a lead and under control whilst on the Parkland, in the Stabling, Campsite and parking areas. Owners must clean up after their dogs. Owners whose dogs are found loose or fouling without cleaning up will incur £20 fines which will be donated to the Event Official Charity.

**STABLING:** A limited number of stables are available for competitors. Stables will be available from Wednesday 20th August 2025. Due to a limit on the number of stables available, competitors will only be able to book a stable

for the night before OR the night after they compete. There will be the opportunity when booking a stable to request additional nights. If there is availability, these will be allocated once entries close.

Stabling will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Stable bookings must be made at time of entry.

Bookings close **Monday 4th August 2025**, or when all stables are filled; strictly **no** applications will be accepted after this date. No refunds will be given for stabling cancelled after the closing date.

Please contact the Horse Trials Office if you need to resell your stable. Competitors are **not** permitted to sublet stables or resell stables without prior written permission from the Organisers. This is to ensure we have the correct contact details in case of veterinary emergencies.

Ponies may not be kept in horseboxes overnight. Pens are not permitted overnight or during the day. Anyone erecting pens will be asked to remove them.

Straw is supplied for bedding; competitors requiring shavings are welcome to bring their own or purchase them at the event. Hay and mucking-out tools are not supplied. For those who have booked stabling for the night prior to their competition day, access to the site will be possible from 4pm the day before your competition. All stables MUST be vacated and mucked out by 2pm on the day of departure.

**CAMPING:** Only competitors who have booked stables are permitted to stay overnight in their horseboxes. Competitors who have not booked stabling must leave the parkland at the end of the show day.

Competitors requiring an additional pass for a car and caravan or tent must contact the Horse Trials Office in advance. Caravans or cars without the correct pass will be redirected to a Car Park or the Event campsite, where they will be required to purchase parking or pitch rental, if available. There is no camping permitted in any Car Parks.

**ALL** competitors, riders and owners **must** obey the instructions to enter and leave the site and follow directions given for horsebox parking by the stewards and officials in charge of this area.

To comply with the Fire Services' instructions, if you are sleeping in your trailer/lorry, there **must** be a **4-metre gap** in each direction from your trailer/horsebox

Excluding competitors staying in their horsebox, there is no camping/tents permitted in the lorry parking – this will be enforced.

Diesel generators are permitted, providing they are correctly earthed, sited away from flammable materials, and fuel is safely stored. The Organisers may check generators and remove any deemed unsafe. Generators should not be run during Quiet Hours. **Petrol generators are not allowed under any circumstances.** 

Campers are requested to respect other guests and keep noise (including generator noise) to a reasonable level – Quiet Hours will be in effect between 11pm and 7am.

## DISRUPTIVE OR ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

If in the opinion of the Organisers, any competitor or any member of their group is found to be disruptive or behaving in a way which may be detrimental the event or other competitors, they will be asked to leave the venue. **THIS INCLUDES UNDERAGE DRINKING**. No refunds will be given for stabling or entry fee.

**LIABILITY:** Except for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers, Scone Palace International Horse Trials, nor any Agent, employee or representative of these bodies accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury, illness to horses, riders, owners, grooms, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.

**INSURANCES:** All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to **keep the policy up to date**.

**LOSS OR DAMAGE:** The Organisers accepts no responsibility whatsoever for loss, injury, or damage, however caused, to any person, animal, or property in the parkland, in stables or in car parks.

**CHILDREN:** children under the age of 16 must be supervised by an adult while riding/handling horses or ponies, except for while competing in a class.

**CURFEW:** There is a curfew on riding each evening from 7pm throughout the event. This includes warm-up arenas and hacking as well as competition arenas. Horses and pones may still be exercised in hand or lunged after this time. Anyone found riding after curfew may be asked to leave the venue. No refunds will be given for stabling or entry fee.

#### **ADMISSION**

Two **passes** will be allocated for the first entered pony, with one additional pass for each additional horse or pony thereafter. Children under the age of 16 do not require a pass. One vehicle pass will be allocated per entry form.

Each additional vehicle or person must purchase the correct tickets through the <u>website</u>. Lorries or trailers that do not contain a horse will not be allowed into the horsebox parking.

Please note, if you are stabling the night after your competition you will not be able to gain access to the event without purchasing further tickets.

**LORRY PASSES AND TICKETS** will be collected on arrival with your competitor pack. E tickets and vehicle passes will be sent to you from 12 August. Please ensure your email details are correct when entering.

### DATA PROTECTION

By entering any class through the Entrymaster System, you agree to the following:

- To allow the data provided on the entry form to be processed and stored electronically for the purposes of
  managing your competition entry and to it being shared with third party organisations for verification of
  qualifying status and results etc. e.g., for affiliated or related championships and finals.
- To the owner's/competitor's name and horse's details to be displayed in the official catalogue, and to be released to appropriate third parties.
